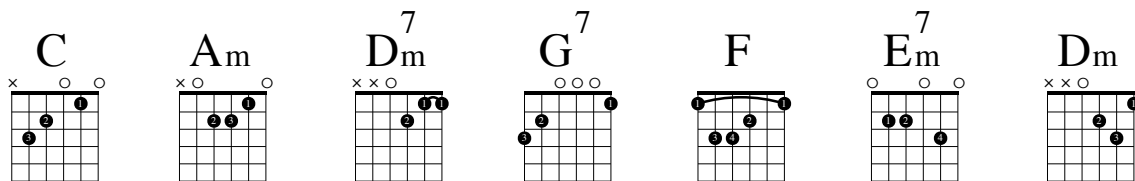


Skye Boat Song
